Criteria for Admission

	<u>Students Must:</u>
Agriscience	Utilize the basic knowledge and principles of carpentry, masonry, concrete finishing, electrical work, HVAC, and plumbing.
Business/Marketing	Utilize skills in organization, time management, customer service, communication, and effective use of technology.
Accounting	Have strong computational, analytical, and interpersonal skills and effective use of technology
Masonry	Utilize modules such as Mortar, Metalwork in Masonry, and Estimating
Welding	Utilizes NCCER's four-level curriculum covering topics such as Oxyfuel Cutting, Welding Symbols, and Stainless Steel Groove Welds.
Junior ROTC	Be motivated to learn the value of citizenship, leadership, service to community, personal responsibility, self-esteem, teamwork and self-discipline.
Business Technology Application	Utilize skills in organization, time management, customer service, communication, and effective use of technology.
